A communicable disease is an illness caused by an infectious agent or its toxic product that can be transmitted in a workplace from person to person. Examples of communicable diseases that may circulate in a workplace include COVID-19, norovirus, and seasonal influenza.

SICK POLICY

The Kamloops Film Society has a strict no-sickness policy with staff so that we actively work against any transmitted viruses. If an employee is ill, they will be asked to stay home. Symptoms of a communicable disease include chills, coughing, sneezing, etc.

ON SITE
