



### **Chris Locke - Actor**

Chris Locke is a comedian, actor, writer, performer from Toronto, Ontario. Best known for his roles on *Run the Burbs* (CBC), *What We Do in the Shadows* (FX), *Baroness Von Sketch Show* (IFC), *Mr. D* (CBC), and as the creator, writer and performer of the Canadian Comedy Award nominated *Learning Nature with Chris Locke* (Funny or Die). Chris is also a co-host of the Evil Men podcast along with comedian/writers Michael Balazo and James Hartnett. In 2022, Chris released his first stand up comedy special, *Captain Bones*, on Crave. In 2023, Chris starred as private eye Larry Constable in the box office hit *Who's Yer Father?*, which was his first starring role in a feature film.

### Jason Arsenault - Producer

Jason's films have screened around the world. He is an alumni of the National Screen Institute's Features First Program, the NSI's Business for Producers Program, The Whistler Producer's Lab and The Rotterdam Producers Lab. He is now in post-production on his next feature, set for release this summer, and has new projects in development with The Canadian Media Fund, Bell Fund, CBC, and Telefilm.





### Kirk Smith - Q&A Host

Kirk was born and raised in Kamloops. He caught the bug early and knew that he wanted to be a performer by the time he was a teenager. Right out of high-school he moved to New York City to study at the American Musical and Dramatic Academy in New York City. He was able to do a few projects in New York after graduating, but he quickly realized that it was important to him to live in Canada. He has mostly lived in Vancouver since, with a couple of stints in Kamloops, and he has had a busy career acting on stages across the country. Kamloops has always held an important place in his heart, and he was excited to move back to the area this past summer with his wife, Robyn, who he met working at Western Canada Theatre. He looks forward to becoming more involved in the community now that he lives here. He is grateful for all the amazing friends and colleagues he has met along the way and the constant love and support of Robyn and the rest of his family.
